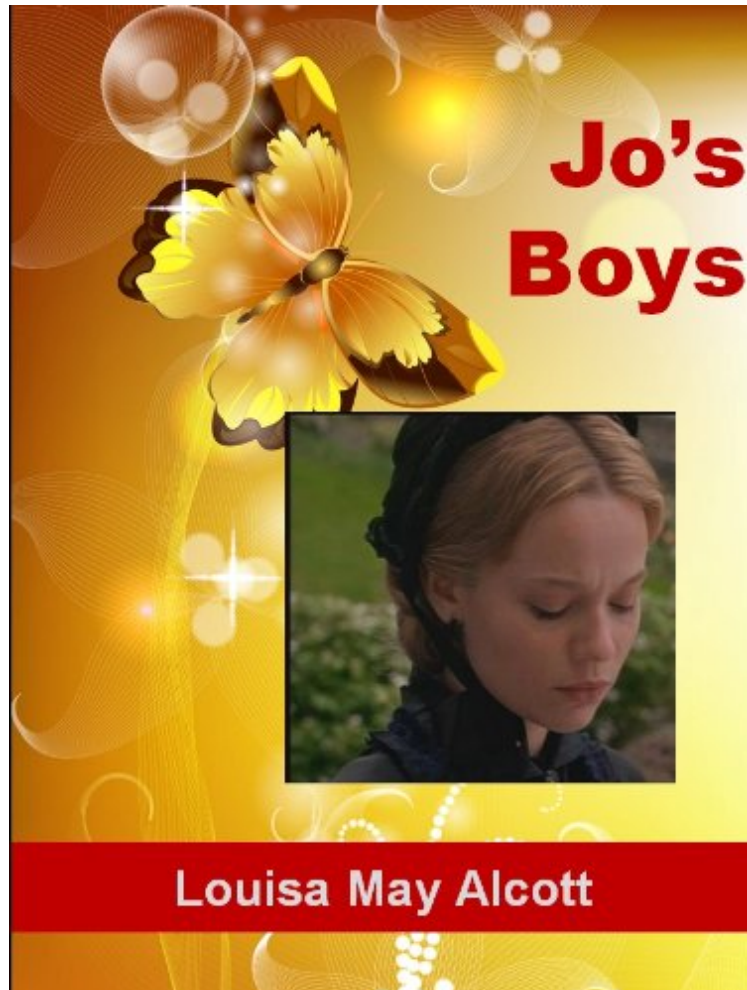

Von smashinkohakuber den Inhalt des Buches muss man ber 100 Jahre nach Erscheinen wohl nichts mehr sagen. Man bekommt, was man erwartet. Ich habe allerdings noch nie ein so schlechtes Seitenlayout mit so vielen Wort- und Zeichenfehlern gesehen und bezweifle sehr stark, dass das schon im Original so war. Es gibt beinahe keinen Abstand zum Blattrand, keine Seitenzahlen. Es finden

sich oft Semikola ohne jeglichen Anlass. Eine häufig angewandte Art der Anführungszeichen wurde scheinbar durch "accents" ersetzt, was zu unnötig langen Wortabständen führt und oft sind schlichte Wörter falsch gedruckt worden (so wird schon manchmal "the" statt "she" geschrieben...). Alles in allem desaströs und man fragt sich ernstlich, ob jemand das Buch vor der Veröffentlichung gelesen hat und ob es evtl. in einer Nacht vom Original abgetippt wurde. Das hätte ich selbst besser hinbekommen! Sehr ärgerlich. Bitte um mehr Kontrolle dessen, was hier so verkauft werden darf! It is truly one of the two best books I have ever read. (The other of course is Little Women). Little Men is a book that can make you both laugh and cry. The morals inside are more useful than any of the ten commandments. Louisa May Alcott has definitely done it again. Without giving away everything, these are some of the reasons why you will enjoy the book: 1) You see Jo grow up. She is no longer the wild child whose impetuous and androgynous character often led her to trouble. She inherits maternal qualities that you never expected Jo to have. 2) You will get more insight on the professor. Although I truly wanted Teddy and Jo to get together, this book made me think otherwise. Professor Bhaer, with Jo's help, makes a delightful father to the boys. He is the one you will get most of the life morals from. 3) The boys in Plumfield are definitely the key figures in the book. They create both the mischievous and melancholy stories. As I said, 'you'll laugh and cry'. Reading about these boys will make everyone reflect on their own lives. 4) Teddy grows up too. If you enjoyed the young scandalous Teddy, you'll enjoy the new one even more. In Little Men, Teddy (like Jo) has grown into a real mature father. There are plenty more exciting things in the book.
