Wieder einmal wird Bertie zu etwas beredet, worauf er so gar keine Lust hat. Diesmal soll er Lord Percy Worplesdon, dem Ehemann seiner schrecklichen Tante Agatha (the one who chews broken bottles and kills rats with her teeth), helfen, geheime Verhandlungen mit einem amerikanischen Reeder zu fhren. Damit keiner Verdacht schpft, soll er sich in Steeple Bumbleigh in der Nhe von Bumbleigh Hall das kleine Cottage "Wee Nooke" mieten. Unglcklicherweise, hat Edwin, Lady Florence Crayes kleiner Bruder und Pfadfinder noch einige gute Taten offen, die abgearbeitet werden mssen. Florence, Berties Ex-Verlobte ist mittlerweile mit Stilton Cheesewright verlobt, der sich als Landpolizist verdingt hat und einen unwillkommenen Konkurrenten um Florence in Bertie sie, der wiederum eher Angst hat, dass Florence sich wieder gegen seinen Willen erneut mit ihm verloben knnte. Als wre das noch nicht genug Liebesverwirrung, ist da noch Zenobia Hopwood Lord Worplesdons Mndel, die bis ber beide Ohren in Berties nichtsnutzigen, trottelligen Freund 'Boko' Fittleworth verliebt ist, den Lord Worplesdons jedoch auf den Tod nicht ausstehen kann. Zenobia will, dass Bertie fr diesen ein gutes Wort bei Lord Worplesdon einlegt, whren Boko einen verrckten Plan nach dem anderen ausheckt, wie er sich bei Lord Worplesdon beliebt machen knnte. "Joy in the Morning" von P.G. Wodehouse aus dem Jahr 1946 in der achte Roman in der Jeeves Reihe. Man muss aber die anderen sieben Romane bzw. Hrspiele nicht kenne, um diesem hier problemlos folgen zu knnen, denn dieses Abenteuer ist in sich abgeschlossen. Man sollte die Hauptpersonen und ihre Macken soweit kennen, mehr braucht es nicht, diesem Hrspiel folgen zu knnen, und Trnen zu lachen. Anders als beim Hrspiel The Inimitable Jeeves handelt es sich diesmal um eine durchgehende Geschichte und nicht um eine Kurzgeschichtensammlung. Man merkt dem Hrspiel sein Alter nicht an. Obwohl es aus dem Jahr 1975 stammt, ist es frisch und witzig, wie am ersten Tag. Der Cast ist berschaubar. Erneut spricht Michael Hordern Jeeves und Richard Briers Bertie Wooster. Irritierend fand ich nur, dass Edwin the Boy Scout von einer Frau gesprochen wurde, das merkt man leider sehr deutlich. Aber die restlichen anderen Sprecher sind wunderbar typgerecht besetzt. Stern Whacks in Steeple Bumbleigh Von Donald Mitchell Joy in the Morning is one of those marvelous country comedies satirizing the English gentry that P.G. Wodehouse excelled at. The satire takes the familiar path of the nobility having more money and breeding than brains, while the ordinary folk are plagued by their nonsense. Wodehouse once noted that you could either do fiction starting from real life or start from the perspective of musical comedy. He chose the latter approach. Woolly-headed Bertram (Bertie) Wooster finds himself inevitably drawn into the lair he most fears, the country home of his demanding Aunt Agatha in Steeple Bumbleigh. He is ambivalent about Aunt Agatha, both fearing her, and relying on her for substantial funds. Unfortunately for him, his gentleman's gentleman, Jeeves, is the cause of the entrapment in Steeple Bumbleigh this time. So there is no escape, because Bertie would never be able to outmaneuver Jeeves. The cause of the geographic diversion on this occasion is that Jeeves would like to do a spot of fishing there, and you know how it is when Jeeves wants something. On the surface it looks like Uncle Percy merely needs a favor, but Jeeves is obviously working both sides of the street for his own benefit. Bertie has never had any good fortune in Steeple Bumbleigh. His Aunt Agatha has always been stern and strongly disapproving of him, while being very overbearing in her demands. Recently, she has remarried to Perceival, Lord Worplesdon, who once chased Bertie for a mile successfully brandishing a riding crop on Bertie's backside as a result of a youthful misunderstanding. Percy's son, Edwin, is worse than any juvenile delinquent you can imagine, because he operates under the cover of a do-gooding Boy Scout in creating his mayhem. Uncle Percy's daughter, Florence Craye, had once been engaged to Bertie, and he had barely avoided her unwanted grasp. No wonder Bertie avoids Steeple Bumbleigh like the River Styx. The potential horrors of Steeple Bumbleigh for Bertie are fortunately reduced in this story by the absence of Aunt Agatha and her son, Thos., who is suffering from the mumps. But Aunt Agatha imposes on Bertie in her absence to bring down a gift for her stepdaughter, Florence Craye, and thus the complications begin. Before long, Bertie is at loggerheads with the usual suspects and at risk of wedding bells. In the meantime he does his best to secure wedding bells for the right couples, avoid them himself, and help out Aunt Agatha and Uncle Percy. And that's a big order, indeed, this time in Steeple Bumbleigh because matters become quite messy. Bertie usually makes his own trouble, but Jeeves, Edwin, and his old pal, Boko Fiddleworth, provide it in spades in this engaging story. Bertie soon feels like he has the proverbial tyre tracks on his body from being run over by misfortune at their hands. But after having satisfied his fishing yen, Jeeves saves the day with a brilliant and audacious improvisation, as he often does in these hilarious stories. I found the plot line to be even more charming and fun than the usual Bertie and Jeeves tale in this story. Bertie's character works better as an innocent dupe (his role in Joy in the Morning) than as an arrogant bumbler, as he is sometimes portrayed in others of these stories. Because of the musical comedy air of the novel, it is vastly improved by being heard in a good recording. After you have finished this story, I suggest that you think about where reticence about sticking up for your rights can land you in the hash, as it were. When someone presumes to make a demand upon you, when is it right to remonstrate and refuse . . . and when not? Certainly, miscommunication is Wodehouse's stock in trade, but it need

Das einfache Leben des steinreichen Erben Bertram Wooster in London, auf dem Lande und manchmal in New York, bietet in seiner augenzwinkernden Schlichtheit viel Humor und in den simpel erscheinenden Stories versteckt ist, meist in Form vom Kammerdiener Jeeves oder den forschenden Damen der englischen Oberschicht, doch ein Hauch Sozialkritik und die Ahnung, dass der Spaß bald vorbei sein wird (die Handlungen spielen vor dem 2. Weltkrieg). Evelyn Waugh und Steven Fry gehören zu den Verehrern Wodehouses, der, manchmal etwas naiv, einfach wollte, dass es allen gut geht. Während und nach der Lektüre von *Joy in the Morning* geht es einem gut!
