Dragonlance novel, but I wish they wrote this one. Tas is an amazing character. So good in fact that they couldn't find a replacement even for the next generation "Dragons of Summer Flame" novel. The Chronicles and Legends series needed him; they would have been too serious and stagnant without the kender's comic relief. When I first heard that TSR were doing a Preludes series, I knew this was the one I wanted to read above all else. I was desperately hoping the author would be someone who could reproduce the irrepressible, fun-loving characteristics set by Weis and Hickman. Alas my hopes were in vain. Kirchoff creates a personality which is altogether too serious and not the care-free persona we've come to know and love. Incidents such as Tas's encounter with the woolly mammoth just didn't seem at all funny. In the Chronicles, Tas was at his best (wittiest!) when feeding off Flint. I thought therefore it might have been fitting if Tas and Flint had journeyed together for a while but that didn't happen either. There is a fairly good plot (albeit a touch unrealistic) here with the occasional twist to make it a fairly exciting read, but it's a crying shame that the central (legendary) figure is so poorly characterised. If like me you're a huge Tas fan, then this novel will hugely disappoint you.

Von Helpful AdviceKendermore is second book in DragonLance Preludes series written by Mary Kirchoff. As I wrote in review for some other epic fantasy book, it's strange to read once again book that's been thrilling to you in the past because when 20 or more years passed you feel about it probably different. Kendermore is a fantasy book that takes place in the DragonLance world, in the land of Krynn, and it describes events and characters that are described in the DragonLance Chronicles trilogy. This book is mostly about Tasslehoff Burrfoot, who is small sized character, like a hobbit, of a kender race that is famous for their courage and telling of good stories. He is called back home due to his marriage but he is not really interested to do that, because he doesn't want to settle down yet. When the bounty hunter sent by a mayor will get him they will experience countless exciting events on their way across the Krynn. Among other things, they will meet mad wizards, treasure hunters and experience terrible sea storms. Tasslehoff was back then one of my dearest Krynn characters but in this book he was pictured more like a pure comedian guy that makes whole book mainly intended for young teens or even younger audience. The story itself isn't uninteresting or difficult to read but presentation is very different to DragonLance Chronicles books, especially considering humor scenes that aren't funny to anyone older than 5 or 6 years old and the major objection, complete lack of characters development. The reader doesn't see any main characters development through the entire book but also we aren't able to learn anything about kender race that can be expected from the book that bears their name. The supporting dwarf and human characters are more detailed explained and they are more generally more interesting as characters. Kendermore is a funny ride through Krynn world from a kender's perspective and for its reading it isn't necessary to read any other DragonLance book. Unfortunately, only a little more serious literary style could make of this work a lot more fun and better work to read. Since that didn't happen, this book still can be recommended only to DragonLance fans who want to read all the works that are related to this fantastic world.

She was the one who was dragging him back to Kendermore to get married to a girl who hated his guts! She had never shown him any friendliness. Although Tas wouldn't have hated her, he wouldn't have been too sad when she died. The use of the Kender Mourning Song in that chapter ticked me off. It was a beautiful, tear-jerking poem when it was used in Dragons of Spring Dawning to lament Flint's death, but in the case of Gisella's death, it meant nothing. Why am I gracing the book with three stars? The reason drives me nuts. Although the characters and such were awful, the storyline was captivating. I couldn't stand putting down the book for good--especially since I had paid six bucks for it (a lot for someone of my status).
