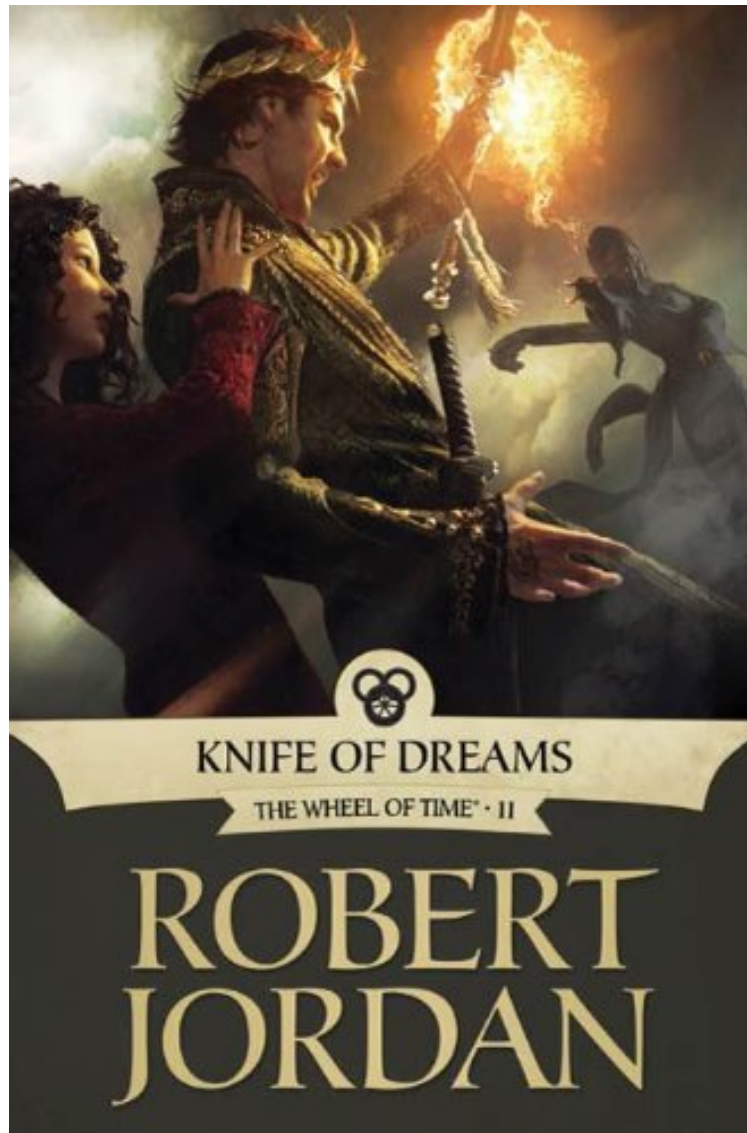

Perrins groes mittelfristiges Ziel wird endlich erreicht, ebenso wie Elaynes. Mat und Egwene kommen ihren ein groes stck nher, wie schon erwht ohne Cliffhanger, aber Lust auf mehr machend. Rand taucht wie im letzten Buch nur kurz auf, kann aber ein lang erwartetes Ereigniss hinter sich bringen. Einer der Morde der die Fangemeinde seit langem beschftigt wird aufgeklrt, die Handlungslinie mit Mat, Moiraine und den Schlangen und Fchsen, auch lange erwartet, wird angestoen. Insgesamt wird unheimlich viel in diesem Buch abgehandelt, im Nachhinein betrachtet beschleicht einen ein gefhl von Torschluss-Panik. Von Joachim Horn Nach langem Warten und einer gewissen Entuschung ber die Bcher 7-10 findet Robert Jordan endlich wieder einen Teil der ursprnglichen Erzhlweise wieder. Einige der der Handlungsstrnge, die in den letzten Bchern teilweise langatmig aufgebaut wurden, werden nun endlich abgeschlossen (Perrin/Faile etc.). Weiterhin verrt Jordan auch einige der Geheimnisse, ber die man sich in vorhergehenden Bnden den Kopf zerbrochen hat (Thom Morraines Brief etc.). Manche Sachen fangen jetzt erst an, so richtig interessant zu werden (zB Logain, Cadsuane, Galad). Insgesamt liest sich (endlich wieder) das Buch sehr zgig durch, eine konstante Spannung herrscht vor. Besonders gelungen ist der Egwene-Thread, der geradezu mit Siebenmeilenstiefeln fortschreitet. Auch der Mat/Tuon-Thread liest sich sehr gut. Insgesamt fhlt man sich, als stnde Tarmon Gaidon unmittelbar bevor. Kritikpunkte: 1. manche Sachen (Aram, Rolan) werden zu schnell abgeschlossen, fast als htte Robert Jordan keine Lust mehr auf manche Charaktere, die er in den vorherigen Bnden mhsam ausgeschmckt hat. 2. der Rand-Thread ist insgesamt sehr enttuschend. Von dem interessanten Charakter der ersten Bnde ist nichts mehr brig. 3. der Perrin-Thread hat viel zu lange gedauert. Das htte schneller gehen mssen. 4. Wer braucht den Elayne-Charakter? Diesen Teil zu lesen, hat eindeutig am lngsten gedauert und war am langweiligsten. alles in allem aber ein Buch, bei dem man den Eindruck bekommt, das RJ wirklich die Serie mit den nchsten zwei Bchern abschlieen will.
