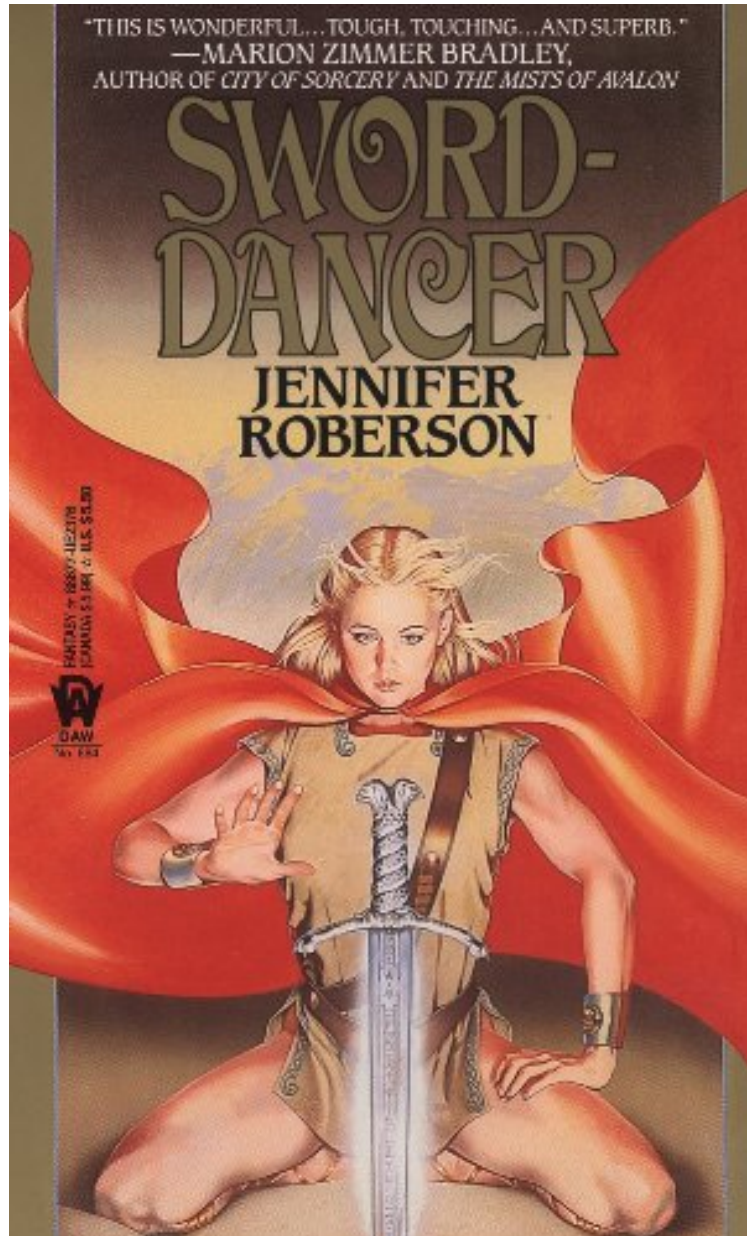

It speaks well for the author's talent that it succeeds in either category. Whatever you do, begin with this book, the first in the series, and read them in order. The Tiger/Del relationship is notable for its complexity as well as the variety of interactions. To a certain extent, both are required to show some adaptiveness over time; one watches them learn and grow. As products of very different societies, we see their pre-existing cultural expectations giving way--obstinately--to the realities of life. It is impossible to miss the feminist statement that Del represents, but there is much more going on than just that. If you could care less about sexual politics and just want to read about interesting characters in a richly detailed environment with a very high excitement level, you also came to the right series. While there is some obvious linguistic and cultural borrowing from medieval earth, it never detracts from the tale. It also has a delightful level of mature humour to keep matters lighthearted. A must read.

Ich habe die Serie verschlungen (im Deutschen besteht sie aus 7 Bänden, wobei die letzten beiden Bände zwei Teile eines Originals sind) Danach machte ich mich an den - ebenfalls hochgelobten - Cheysuly Zyklus... und wurde enttäuscht. Wie dem auch sei. In diesem Auftakt der Serie wird es nicht langweilig, die Charaktere sind wirklich welche, d.h. wie wirken authentisch auf den Leser und die Handlung lässt auch keine Langeweile aufkommen. Im englischen Original liest sich die Geschichte recht flüssig und die Kindle-Edition ist mit sehr wenigen Fehlern behaftet. Das Buch ist m.E. auch für deutsche Leser geeignet, die noch nicht sooooo viel Erfahrung mit englischer Lektüre haben. Einige Begriffe mögen zwar unbekannt sein, aber die Geschichte an sich lässt sich sehr gut verfolgen - vor allem wenn man darauf verzichtet, gleich jedes einzelne Wort nachzuschlagen.
