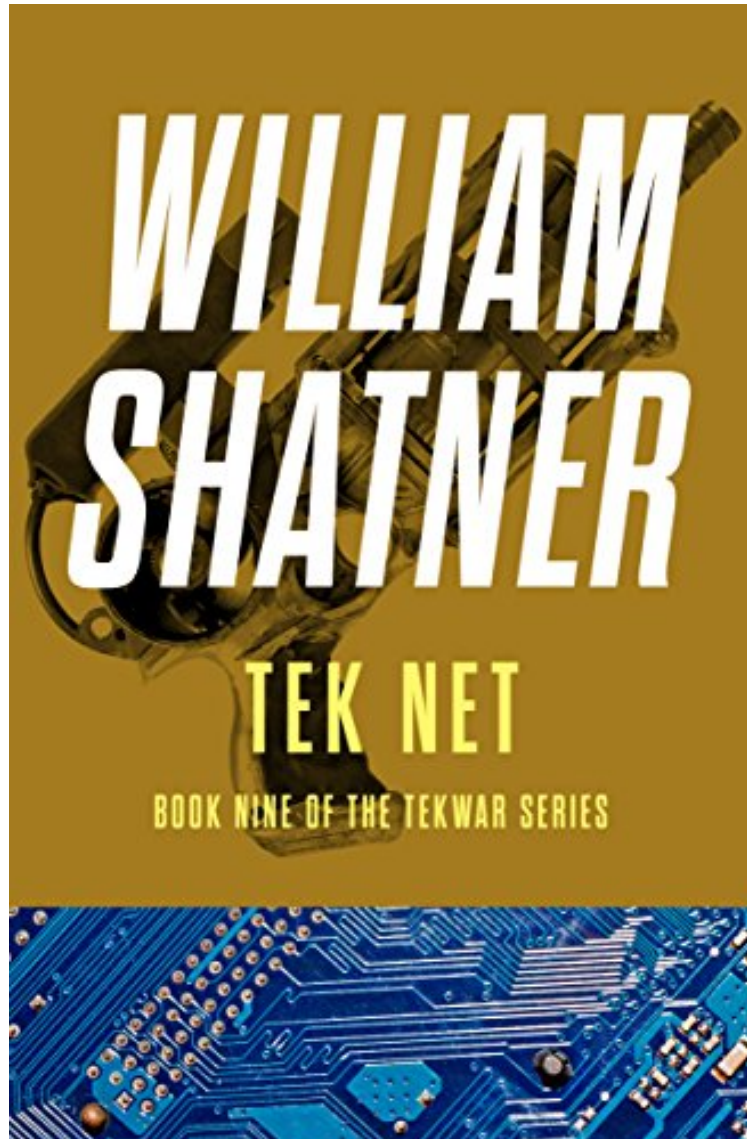

The hardware was sleek, the action was merciless, and the end of each page dared you not to turn to the next. Almost ten years later, not much has

changed for Jake Cardigan and company. Jake's still the tough, angst ridden private eye with a heart of gold. Gomez is still a wise cracking charmer, and both manage to get themselves in ridiculous amounts of trouble in the course of the story, only to tap dance their way out of it by the end, which almost always falls around 250 pages. Like the rest, Teknet's story is told with rare style and wit, but the Tek "cast" doesn't ever really change. But, with a "Tek" book, you're not looking for a character study, just a fast paced thrill ride. Teknet delivers on that. The main problem is that this, being the last of a series of books that has soaked up an entire decade, gives no real sense of closure to the series. At the end, things are pretty much the way they started, and the boys still seem poised to take Bascm's next call. Von Ein Kunde One of the things I learned to do over the course of the Tek series was not to take it overly seriously. I had to learn to ignore Locus' review; "...a combination of Miami Vice and Blade Runner." Actually it's more like Rockford Files and The Jetsons, with a little of Speedy Gonzales thrown in for seasoning by way of partner Sid Gomez's frequent Latinisms. This is no lie--when they announced a "Tek" TV series, I expected the Gomez role to be filled by Cheech Marin, and this was a few years before Nash Bridges. I'm sure author Shatner knows more about what real Latinos are like than what his Gomez character seems to suggest. All of the hokey high tech like lazguns and smartass robots is a real howl. Shatner says this'll be the last one, so go back and read the earlier ones too. Sci-fi comedy isn't all that plentiful.
