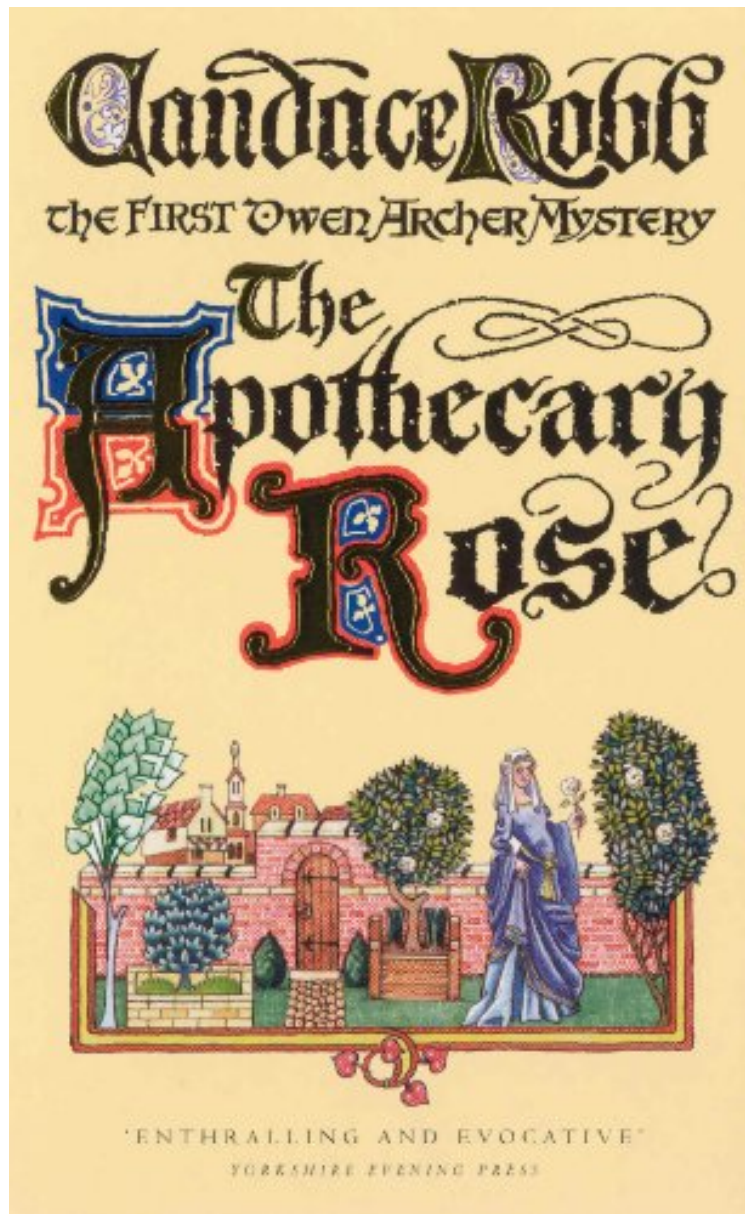

Excellent portrayal of medieval York during the reign of Edward III. Lucie Wilton, the apothecary's wife and apprentice, is one of several suspects in a case that turns out to be much more twisted than either Owen or the Archbishop expected, reaching back into the past of a number of characters, at least one of which is not about to allow any light to be shed on the subject of the mysterious deaths in the abbey infirmary. Owen is an engaging character, torn between his cocky self assurance and his doubts about his future since the loss of his eye. Lucie is a feisty, opinionated, independent woman who is not willing to be ordered by men with even the best intentions.
