I actually read *The Red Sea* before I worked my way through the *Cycle of Arawn*, which was painful. Having *The Cycle of Arawn* as comparison I can hardly believe how much the author has improved! There is much more depth to the characters than before, the story just flows, pulling you along, and the few remaining deus ex machina moments were far better handled than in the *Cycle*.
To the story itself (SPOILERS) Dante receives a letter from his father, whom he long believed dead and who, at least according to the letter, is now actually dying. Dante reluctantly makes the journey to the aptly named Plagued Islands (Guess where Dante's father's health problems come from?) and agrees to go on a risky journey to locate and bring back the remedy needed by his father. The problem: the native population consists of pathological liars. The bigger problem: they have reason to lie. And quite possibly less scruples than Dante...
What I didn't like was the complete absence of Cee. She is one of the characters that I truly liked in the *Cycle of Arawn* and the ending of the third book had hinted at her playing a bigger role in the future. I really hope she comes back in the next book. She is one of the two characters that interacts with Dante, the man, and not with Dante, High Priest of Arawn.

If you have read the *Cycle of Arawn*, be prepared to be knocked off your feet. If you haven't be prepared for solid entertainment mixed with occasional confusion, when prior events are referenced. But one CAN read *The Red Sea* without having read the *Cycle of Arawn*. You might not get some references but you won't have any problems understanding what's happening.
