Books are getting worseVon LeyThe first book in the series wasn't perfect but a solid sci-fi story with an unusual setting and idea. I liked it.Unfortunately by book 3 this story has some major flaws due to the fact that the author doesn't bring any depth to it.While i could understand the brainless hatred towards the Riss in the first book because of fear ("they will

take over our body's and minds" etc) by book 3 several years! later in the timeline this attitude is just absurd and very boring to read. If the author actually explained or at least described the involved characters more deeply i would not mind but he doesn't. The characters are either honorable and smart or plain stupid bigots. A lot of things stay virtually unexplained by book 3:- the public opinion towards the riss by the civilians, army, navy and government- the reasoning of the riss to travel into space doesn't make much sense- the admiralty's attitude towards the riss is positive, why do they have virtually no influence on the behavior of their subordinates? Annoying character interactions: I hate it when authors repeat character conversations or very similar interactions over and over. After 10+ parts of "the riss are soo good for us" "the riss are so honorable" "the riss are soo peaceful" it is getting annoying. The author describes them as angels, but they obviously have no problem with joining the military and killing humans. Very strange... Especially because the goals of the riss and the Sadr Alliance of Stars could be achieved a lot easier if they had not joined the military. Considering there are only a few thousand riss (by today's standards they are an endangered species!!!) up until book 3 the riss have gained exactly nothing by going to the stars and lost quite a few of their population. If they just earned some money on saipha and bought a civilian space ship they would be a lot better off. Why they want to leave the only planet on which humans do not hate them in the first place is beyond my imagination.
