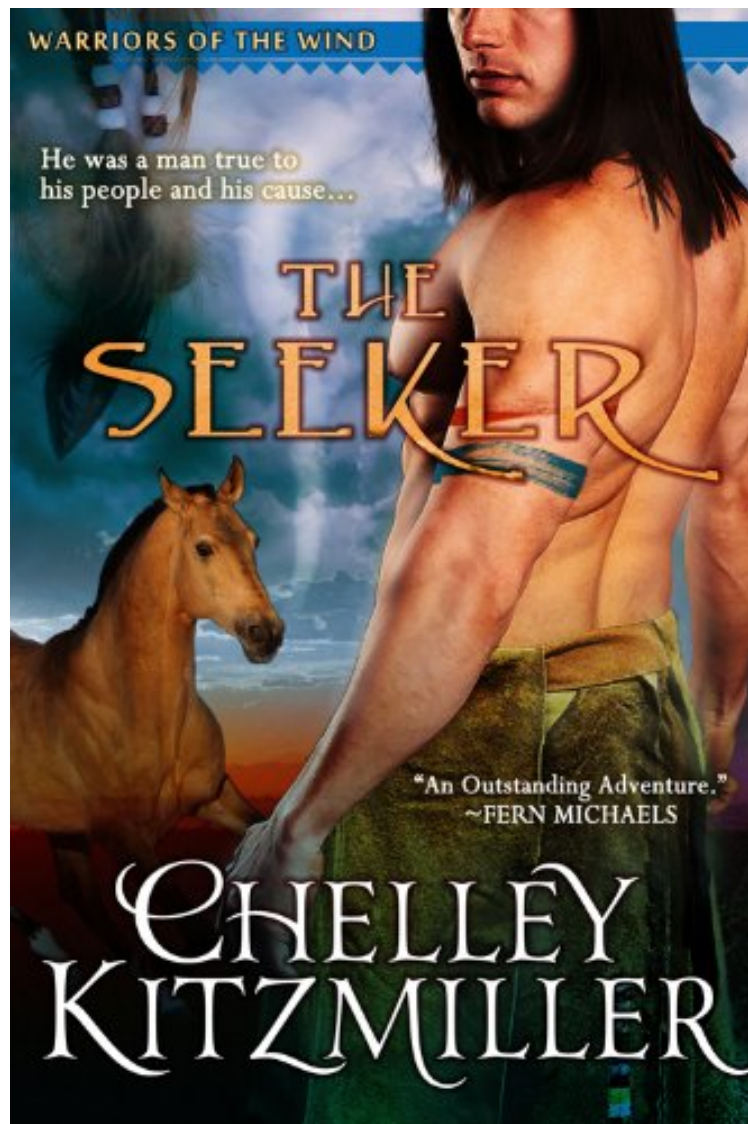

Sie wollen dort ein neues Leben beginnen, haben eine Zeitung gegründet und wollen die Menschen mit ihren Artikeln über das Geschehen in dieser Gegend informieren. Sie haben hierbei hohe Ansprüche, ganz im Gegensatz zu den dort bereits ansässigen Blättern, die jedes Gerücht, bewiesen oder nicht, abdrucken. Zu dieser Zeit, man schreibt das Jahr 1871, ist Tucson ein gottverlassenes Nest, mitten im Gebiet der Apachen.
